Day Wise Itinerary:

Day 1: Arrival in Bangalore & Half-Day Sightseeing Tour

Airport or Railway Station, prepare to be warmly welcomed by our representatives who will assist you with your transfer to your hotel. After checking in, you will have some time to yourself to unwind and prepare before we embark on a tour during your inaugural day in the Silicon Valley of India. We will explore this enchanting city, affectionately known as 'The Garden City.'

We will commence our journey at the Bangalore Palace, a splendid 19th-century edifice nestled amidst lush gardens in the city's heart. This site is a favorite among both locals and tourists, showcasing architectural marvels from a bygone era, with intricate carvings adorning the interiors of its wooden structures. Delve into the medieval castles and uncover the rich heritage of the royal families that once ruled from this magnificent palace.



Next, we will visit the Sri Radha Krishna Temple, located just a 15-minute drive from the palace. This temple stands as one of the largest ISKCON (International Society for Krishna Consciousness) temples globally. Its grandeur is evident in the use of only the finest materials, including granite, marble, and glass imported from Korea, ensuring a breathtaking experience.

Continuing our exploration in the heart of Bangalore, we will stop by the Karnataka Chitrakala Parishath, a stunning structure built in 1960 that serves as a museum dedicated to preserving the culture and art of Bangalore. This venue houses museums, galleries, and archives that showcase both modern and contemporary art, as well as traditional artworks, some created by students from The College of Fine Arts and The Bengaluru School of Visual Arts. A highlight of the museum is its impressive collection of Indian Gold Leaf work and Mysore paintings.

The Lal Bagh Botanical Garden is a stunning oasis where one can admire a plethora of red roses that flourish throughout the year. Formerly known as the Rose and Cypress Garden, it is easy to understand why this place is referred to as “The City of Garden.” The Lal Bagh Botanical Garden takes pride in being one of South Asia’s most varied botanical gardens and holds historical significance, having been established in 1760.



Next, we will visit another splendid edifice in Bangalore, Vidhana Soudha, which was completed in 1956. Soaring to a height of 46 meters, guests are welcome to appreciate the exterior of this remarkable Dravidian-style structure. Approximately 5000 individuals contributed to the construction of this magnificent white-granite building, situated directly opposite the High Court of Karnataka.

As dusk approaches, you will have the evening at your leisure. Take the opportunity to explore the local department store or enjoy a leisurely stroll through the enchanting city. Perhaps you might visit a couple of pubs to immerse yourself in the vibrant nightlife! After an exciting night out, retreat to your hotel in Bangalore for a restful night.

Day 2: Journey from Bangalore to Mysore via Srirangapatna

Savor your breakfast this morning before we check out of your hotel and depart from Bangalore. Our destination is the illustrious “City of Palaces,” Mysore, which is a 3.5-hour journey covering 150 kilometers. Along the way, we will make several stops to explore various attractions, ensuring that the lengthy ride remains both thrilling and enriching.



Our initial stop will be Srirangapatna, the historic capital of Tipu Sultan. This area derives its name from the Ranganthaswamy temple, established in 984, a site of both religious and historical significance. It served as the former capital of Mysore during the reign of the illustrious King Tipu Sultan. Upon our arrival, we will undoubtedly visit the renowned Sri Ranganathaswamy Temple, where the manifestation of Lord Vishnu, known as Ranganatha, is venerated. This temple ranks among the five principal pilgrimage sites in Sri Vaishnavism. It is an ancient site, as evidenced by inscriptions indicating its consecration in 984 during the era of the Western Ganga dynasty. The idol housed within this temple is reputed to be the largest representation of Vishnu in the Adidesha or reclining posture in Karnataka.

Following this, we will proceed to the Summer Palace of Tipu Sultan, celebrated for its Indo-Islamic architectural style. This magnificent structure once served as the summer retreat for the Mysorean ruler, Tipu Sultan. The two-story palace, constructed from wood, mortar, stone, and plaster, is enveloped by a stunning garden. The interiors are adorned with floral motifs on the walls, allowing one to envision the leisurely moments spent by Tipu Sultan in this splendid abode. From the palace, we embark on a journey to the Srirangapatna Fort, a structure of significant historical importance that traces its origins back to the era when the Kingdom of Mysore flourished. Located approximately 23 kilometers from Mysore, this fort is easily accessible and was



constructed in the Indo-Islamic architectural style in 1454 by the esteemed Kempe Gowda. It boasts three concentric fort walls and two layers of moats, with crocodiles and snakes raised in the vicinity as natural deterrents, rendering it one of the most formidable forts to breach.

As we proceed on our expedition, we make our way to Gumbaz, the final resting place of Tipu Sultan. Commonly referred to as Gol Gumbad, this Muslim mausoleum houses the tomb of Tipu Sultan, enveloped by a beautifully landscaped garden. Tipu Sultan was interred here in 1799, amidst a garden adorned with cypress trees and a plethora of flowering plants and trees sourced from French Mauritius, Ottoman Turkey, Persia, and beyond. The original intricately carved doors have been removed for display at the Victoria and Albert Museum, while the current ebony doors embellished with ivory inlays were graciously donated by Lord Dalhousie. Following this enlightening tour, we shall return to the hotel for check-in and an overnight stay in Mysore.

Day 3: Journey from Mysore to Ooty

Savor a delightful breakfast at your hotel in Mysore this morning before we proceed to check out. Prepare yourself for a scenic ride to Ooty, also known as Udhagamandalam, which lies



approximately four hours from our current location. As we traverse through the stunning landscapes of Bandipur National Park and the Mudumalai Wildlife Sanctuary, we warmly welcome you to the enchanting hill station of Ooty.

Upon our arrival, we will explore the picturesque Ooty Lake, where you are invited to indulge in horse riding and boating at your leisure. Afterward, we will check in at the hotel, allowing you to unwind after a thrilling day in Ooty.

Day 4: A Complete Day of Ooty Exploration - Lakes & Valleys

After enjoying a delightful breakfast, embark on your full day of sightseeing in Ooty, which includes visits to Avalanche Lake and Emerald Lake.

Avalanche Lake – Located 26 kilometers from Ooty, this lake is renowned for its breathtaking beauty. Surrounded by a lush landscape adorned with blooming flowers such as magnolias, orchids, and rhododendrons, it offers a serene escape. In addition to soaking in the stunning views and the peaceful atmosphere, adventure enthusiasts will find plenty of opportunities for excitement. Please note that after the Avalanche Check Point, it is essential to travel in



government forest vehicles (INR 150 per person) to access the lake.

Emerald Lake – Nestled within the Silent Valley National Park in the Nilgiris District, this lake is a sight to behold, especially during sunrise and sunset. Visitors are drawn to its picturesque beauty, complemented by the verdant Nilgiri slopes and surrounding tea plantations. Don't forget to purchase some of the finest Nilgiri Tea while you're here.

Ketti Valley View – This popular viewpoint is located along the Ooty – Coonoor Road in the Nilgiris. The panoramic view of Ketti from this vantage point is nothing short of majestic, often likened to the stunning landscapes of Switzerland. A telescope room is available for those wishing to get a closer look at the valley and its surroundings. Additionally, this valley is home to a well-known needle manufacturing brand, Pony Needles. After a day of exploration, return to your hotel. The evening is free for personal activities. Enjoy an overnight stay in Ooty.

Day 5: Journey from Ooty to Kodaikanal

Following a delightful breakfast, check out from your hotel and embark on your journey to Kodaikanal (250Kms / 7Hrs), renowned as one of the most exquisite, tranquil, and picturesque hill



stations in Tamil Nadu. Upon arrival, check into your hotel and unwind. Enjoy an overnight stay at the hotel.

Day 6: Full Day Sightseeing Tour - Best of Kodaikanal

After a delightful breakfast, embark on a day of discovery in Kodaikanal, starting with visits to renowned landmarks such as Pillar's Rock, which provides breathtaking panoramic views of the surrounding scenery, and the tranquil Kodai Lake, where you can relax amidst nature's splendor. Proceed to Fairy Falls, a charming waterfall enveloped by lush greenery, ideal for unwinding and rejuvenating.

As the day progresses, enjoy a leisurely stroll along Coaker's Walk, which offers stunning vistas of the mountains and valleys below. Immerse yourself in the peaceful ambiance as you appreciate the picturesque beauty of Kodaikanal. After a day filled with exploration and wonder, retreat for the night in Kodaikanal, treasuring the memories forged amidst the tranquil landscapes.

Nestled between these pillar rocks lies a shadowy chamber known as the 'Devil's Kitchen', commonly referred to as the Guna Caves. This site is one of Kodaikanal's most intriguing yet



perilous attractions. It features unusual rock formations, deep chambers between the rocks, and even deeper chasms formed by soil erosion from the cliffs. It serves as a perfect location for nature and wildlife photography, showcasing the animals and birds that can be observed. Moir Point stands as one of the most favored viewpoints in Kodaikanal, offering serene and magnificent views of the surrounding valleys.

After lunch, visit the Shenbaganur Museum (closed on Thursdays), established in 1895. This museum provides an excellent opportunity to closely examine various artifacts from the ancient Paliyans tribes, along with an extraordinary collection of over 300 exotic orchid species. The museum's main attraction is its remarkable taxidermy collection, which includes more than 500 species of animals, birds, and insects.

The Kurinji Andavar Temple is dedicated to the Hindu deity "Lord Murugan". This temple is adorned with the unique Kurinji flowers that bloom once every twelve years. Visitors can enjoy scenic views of the Palani hills and the Vaigai dam.

Day 7: Journey from Kodaikanal to Bangalore - Departure from Bangalore



Following breakfast, check out from the hotel and make your way to the Bangalore airport or railway station (480Kms/ 8-9hrs) for your onward travel. The tour concludes with cherished memories!
